DISTINGUISHED SPEAKER



Col. Jack Jacobs, US Army (Ret.)

Medal of Honor Recipient

Jack Jacobs was born in Brooklyn, New York. He holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Rutgers University and entered the US Army in 1966 as a Second Lieutenant through the ROTC program.

He was in Vietnam twice, both times as an advisor to Vietnamese infantry battalions, earning three Bronze Stars, two Silver Stars, and the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest combat decoration. Jacobs retired as a Colonel.

He was a Managing Director of Bankers Trust, where he ran foreign exchange options worldwide and was a partner in the institutional hedge fund business.

Jacobs subsequently founded a similar business for Lehman Brothers and then retired again.

An on-air analyst for NBC News, he was a member of the team that produced the 2011 Murrow Award-winning Nightly News segment "Iraq: The Long Way Out." Colonel Jacobs is also the co-author of the memoir, "If Not Now, When?," published by Penguin and winner of the Colby Award. His second work of non-fiction is "Basic," released by St. Martin's Press.

Richard D. Clarke Jr., retired US Army 4-Star general and the former commander of the US Special Operations Command (USSOCOM), is a MITRE Trustee. Before assuming command of USSOCOM at MacDill Air Force Base, Fla., Clarke was director for Strategic Plans and Policy, Joint Staff, at the Pentagon.

Clarke was born in West Germany and raised in an Army family. After graduating from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1984, he was commissioned into the Infantry branch and launched his command journey. Clarke served nearly four decades leading Infantry, Ranger, and Special

Operations in the United States, Europe, Iraq, and Afghanistan. His multiple deployments included Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm, Operation Joint Guardian, Operation Enduring Freedom, and Operation Iraqi Freedom. He served as commander of the 82nd Airborne Division, Commandant of Cadets at the USMA at West Point, and Deputy Commanding General for Operations of the 10th Mountain Division.

His decorations and major awards include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, two Army Distinguished Service Medals, three Defense Superior Service Medals, two Legion of Merit awards, and five Bronze Stars. Clarke earned a Bachelor's degree from West Point and an MBA from Benedictine College. He retired from the military in 2022 and sits on the boards of General Dynamics and Rohirrim.






