2023 marked the 10th year of operations at Boulder Crest Foundation, and as we reflect on our decade-long journey — one that has seen us serve nearly 100,000 people — the words **BIGGER...BOULDER...BETTER...** best encapsulate who we are, what we stand for, where we have been, and where we are going.


BIGGER... When we opened the doors of Boulder Crest Virginia in September 2013, our vision was to serve 700 combat veterans and family members each year. 10 years later, we have served 14 times that number, expanded to a second location (Boulder Crest Arizona), launched an Institute dedicated to the science of Posttraumatic Growth (Boulder Crest Institute), in partnership with the Avalon Action Alliance created a network of 13 teams delivering Warrior PATHH in nine permanent locations (alongside two Mobile Teams), and launched and scaled our Struggle Well training program, which is being delivered to actively serving military members and first responders in 20 states.

BOULDER... We are in the midst of a mental health epidemic that claims far too many lives to suicide. Something must change, and we recognize that our expertise in developing PTG-based programs is exactly what is required. To that end, Boulder Crest is boldly developing and scaling a new approach to stress, struggle, and suicide that our nation's actively serving military, veterans, and first responders deserve and require.

BETTER... At our 10th anniversary celebration, I noted that for all that we have accomplished, we are still just getting started. We never rest on our laurels, and focus on continuously improving every aspect of our work. This has been a critical ingredient in our success, and is something that Ken, I, and our entire BCF team believe in deeply.

In 2023, we changed over 17,000 lives. Over the last decade, we transformed nearly 100,000 lives. **And we're just getting started.**

Thank you for being with us on this journey. We couldn't do it without you.

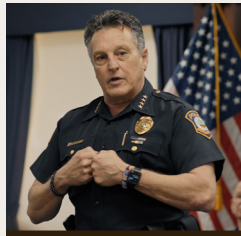

JEREMY'S PATHH

To put it simply, I was struggling. The outside world after my retirement was nothing like I had planned for, trained for, or could relate to. I was able to work, enjoy time with my family, and complete all the required functions of daily life but my mind was tearing itself apart and no matter how hard I tried I couldn't think my way out.

I wanted desperately to change my life, hear a new voice, and live a life where I saw goodness in the world and not the evil I had been trained to hunt down around the world. I was broken and everyone told me so. I had tried all of the standard treatments and medications, but they seemed to make everything worse! A co-worker and former Ranger told me about the change in his life after attending Boulder Crest's Warrior PATHH program and with that kind of recommendation I made the call.

Committing to attend Warrior PATHH was easy as I deeply wanted to change; getting on the plane, however, was incredibly difficult. No matter what I had accomplished in my career I wasn't good enough, and someone needed my seat more than I did and I was just taking their place.

The isolation of where we were staying sank in

as we drove into the Smoky Mountains with only our guide keeping us from sinking into the thoughts in our heads. What followed were seven days that changed the way I live my life, and helped me see myself as others see me. It was intense work mentally, physically, spiritually, and yes, emotionally. We opened up, hesitantly at first, then we all somehow at the same time said "send it" and let the hurt flow! And when the hurt was out in the light, the healing began! It was seven days FILLED with work to do on yourself and supporting the warriors there with you. You will be taught how to help other warriors, your community, and through it help yourself. You will be given the practices to heal the past hurt and given the opportunity to practice them before you leave. If you are desperate to change your life and willing to face the fears and put in the work, you will come out on the other side better but with plenty of work still to do; this time, however, you're prepared.

Why had all of those other treatments failed and this one succeeded? This is a program led by veterans for veterans that doesn't focus on brokenness, it trains you. The men and women that provide this program have sat in the exact seat you're in and faced the exact fears you faced getting on the plane. They care, and they are willing to back it up! Not that "let me know if there is anything you need help with" caring, they're willing to crawl down in that dark pit with you and lift you up on their shoulders so you can see the light caring!

Now, when I have a bad day, I have a much better foundation and a group of brothers that I can rely upon and be honest with that accept me for exactly who I am. They know the battles, they know the inner voice, they are all my fire team engaging the same enemy. If you need the change in your life, get on the PATHH!



JESSICA'S STRUGGLE WELL STORY

Prior to attending a two-day Struggle Well class, I had never heard of the program. Quite honestly, my reasons for taking the class were merely that it was free and that I could get time on the books from my department for attending. At no point was I seeking to get anything from the class other than that. Coincidentally, at that time, I had given up on seeking out any sort of treatment or assistance. Every traditional mental health provider and program I experienced was based on the same premise: I needed to accept my diminished state and “new normal” and the best I could hope for was to manage the symptoms associated with my struggle.

When I walked in it was like any other first responder and military training. Everyone comes in well put together, clean cut, and introducing themselves by their positions and departments. You look around and you see a classroom full of well-rounded, accomplished professionals. This is exactly why I stopped going to classes, because I felt like I did not fit in and that everyone could see that I was not where they were in life.

Then the class started, and it was unlike anything I had ever experienced. As each person spoke, one after another, and probably for the first time ever, they told us the truth. Realizing we are all just putting on a show for one another. That I was not alone, I was not different, and I was not lost. That we all at one point or another have been in the exact same spot but just never told each other. Upon walking out at the end of the second day I had what no professional had ever been able to give me: a direct answer on the next steps that needed to be taken and the realization that we all have been there.



RESEARCH & EVALUATION

Dr. Richard Tedeschi, the founder of the science of Posttraumatic Growth, was named Executive Director of the Boulder Crest Institute when Josh Goldberg assumed the role of CEO in January 2023. Dr. Bret Moore, a former Army psychologist and renowned author, was appointed Deputy Director, and Dr. Tedeschi's mentee and Air Force veteran, Dr. Taryn Greene, was hired as Director of Research. The Institute team launched several new courses and published various PTG-focused studies in 2023.

2023 Boulder Crest Institute Highlights:

- Trained more than 2,000 Mental Health Professionals in the practices and principles of PTG
- Launched a new university-based PTG course for doctoral students at Adler University
- Dr. Tedeschi co-authored five new PTG-focused research studies
- Developed two new books for the emerging Posttraumatic Growth book series
- Published a study evaluating Warrior PATHH outcomes in *Frontiers in Psychology*, which demonstrated the immediate and long lasting impacts of Warrior PATHH on psychological growth and symptom reduction for U.S. military veterans

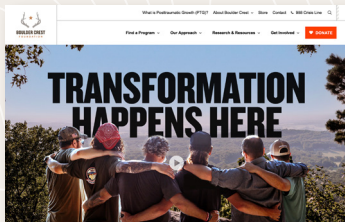

SOCIAL & POLICY CHANGE

September 2023 marked a decade of service for Boulder Crest Foundation. Virginia Governor Glenn Youngkin and First Lady Suzanne S. Youngkin attended our anniversary event and presented Boulder Crest with a Spirit of Virginia award, which recognizes contributions in private industries, education, culture, and arts and philanthropy.

Our work to change the narrative surrounding mental health gained national recognition this year. In a significant win for our advocacy efforts, June 13th was named PTG Awareness Day in a proclamation signed by Rep. Jack Bergman (R-MI).



Our short film *On Duty* — a story about a soldier struggling to put soldiering down once he returns home — won a CLIO Award in the Health Awareness & Advocacy category. The second film in the series, *Reborn*, was released in September and tells the story of a police officer facing a traumatic event in the line of duty, and her struggle in its aftermath. Both films shine a light on the transformative power of our PTG-based programs.

Our 10th year concluded with Founder and Chairman of the Board, Ken Falke, being awarded an AARP® Purpose Prize®. The Purpose Prize honors extraordinary individuals who use their lived experiences to make a better future for all. The past 10 years are certainly an indication that Ken has done just that.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

Michael Vineyard's email signature is "Non Sibi Sed Aliis," which translates to "Not for Himself, but for Others." This is a fitting slogan for Boulder Crest Virginia's 2023 Volunteer of the Year.

Michael served in the Navy for 27 years before he retired and took a federal emergency management position with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Michael felt his call to serve was not being answered in his new career, though, and when he heard about Boulder Crest Foundation he was hooked on the mission and wanted to be involved with helping veterans in some way. He initially volunteered with the Healing Heroes (motorcycle) Ride at the starting location (Berryville VFW) and then rode in the event – and became involved with additional events as time went on.

This changed after Michael went through the Warrior PATHH program himself in 2022. He started to volunteer in the kitchen at the very next PATHH program and comes in for kitchen duty for every PATHH class. "There is a lot of reflection time and sharing with others that have gone through the program who are also volunteering," Michael says.

Throughout 2023, Michael came to the property weekly to help with property management projects. "I do whatever they want me to do. It's such a great mission and I am retired so I just try to fill in the voids."

Michael has done everything from cleaning the kitchen equipment to taking care of the livestock. His favorite activity is still kitchen duty because "I get the honor of supporting and seeing these warriors come through PATHH."

We are deeply appreciative of Michael and how generous he is with his time, wisdom, and talents.
